

Travel Policy

This policy sets out the responsibilities of NSWRL and Clubs in respect to travel for Players and Club Officials for away matches and club responsibilities to the NSWRL Travel and Accommodation Sponsors.

1.1 **NSWRL Responsibilities**

In the **NSW Cup and Jersey Flegg competition/s** matches covered by the following schedule, the NSWRL will pay for the following:

- a. The cost of up to twenty-five (25) economy class (including doctor) air seats for Players and Club Officials utilising NSWRL appointed air travel providers.
- b. The cost of up to twelve (12) twin and one (1) single room for Players and Club Officials utilising NSWRL appointed accommodation providers.

Note: Where games are inter-state, best endeavours will be made to have teams travel within the same day, therefore no accommodation is required

- c. The cost of breakfast for up to twenty-five (25) people of NSWRL contracted supplier's rates.
- d. The cost of transfer between airport / venue / hotel by NSWRL approved transport providers.
- e. The cost of all airport departure and arrival taxes.
- f. In cases where the home team, with agreement of the NSWRL, moves the fixture to a regional or interstate venue not included in the attached schedule, the home team must pay all costs associated with their travel to the game. The NSWRL may consider assistance with costs for the away team.

In the **Jersey Flegg competition for teams travelling to Fiji ONLY**, they will be covered by the below schedule, the NSWRL will pay for the following:

- a. The cost of up to twenty-six (26) economy class (including doctor and media person*) air seats for Players and Club Officials utilising NSWRL appointed air travel providers.
 - *All teams are to travel with a Club media/content officer to comply with the required coverage of the match outlined in the Participation Agreement
- b. The cost of up to thirteen (13) twin rooms and/or twelve (12) twin and two (2) single room for Players and Club Officials utilising NSWRL appointed accommodation providers.
- c. The cost of dinner and breakfast for up to twenty-six (26) people of NSWRL contracted supplier's rates.
- d. The cost of transfer between airport / venue / hotel by NSWRL approved transport providers.
- e. The cost of all airport departure and arrival taxes.



In Andrew Johns/ Laurie Daley/ Men's Country Championships/ Women's Country Championships and regional Lisa Fiaola Cup competition matches covered by the attached schedule, the NSWRL will pay for the following:

- a. The cost of up to twenty-five (25) economy class air seats for Players and Club Officials utilising NSWRL appointed air travel providers.
- b. The cost of up to twelve (12) twin rooms + one (1) single for Players, Club Officials and the Academy Manager for the number of nights determined by NSWRL, utilising NSWRL appointed accommodation providers.
- c. The cost of breakfast for up to twenty-five (25) people at NSWRL contracted supplier's rates.
- d. The cost of transfers between airport / venue / hotel by NSWRL approved transport providers.
- e. The cost of all airport departure and arrival taxes.

In **SG Ball/ Harold Matthews** Competition matches covered by the attached schedule, the NSWRL will pay for the following:

- a. The cost of up to twenty-four (24) economy class air seats for Players and Club utilising NSWRL appointed air travel providers.
- b. The cost of up to twelve (12) twin rooms for Players and Club Officials for the number of nights determined by NSWRL, utilising NSWRL appointed accommodation providers.
 - Note: Where games are inter-state, best endeavours will be made to have teams travel within the same day, therefore no accommodation is required
- c. The cost of dinner/breakfast for up to twenty-four (24) people at NSWRL contracted supplier's rates should you be staying o/night
 - Note: Where games are inter-state and teams travel up and back in the same day there are no provisions, Clubs to arrange their own
- d. The cost of transfers between airport / venue / hotel by NSWRL approved transport providers.
- e. The cost of all airport departure and arrival taxes.



1.2 Club Responsibilities

In the event NSWRL enters into a sponsorship or other commercial arrangement with an airline or accommodation provide, Clubs will be required to utilise the services of the official NSWRL airline or accommodation provider.

If the NSWRL does not have a sponsorship arrangement in place, Clubs may seek NSWRL approval to use other travel and accommodation providers. Approval will be solely at the discretion of NSWRL and may be revoked at any time. If such approval is granted, Clubs will be required to meet any cost variation between the provider of their choice and what would normally be provided by NSWRL.

In all cases Clubs will meet any other costs incurred in respect of participating in NSWRL Competition matches, including, but not limited to: -

- a. All meals (except breakfast or where dinner is specified) for all Players and Club Officials.
- b. The cost of bus transfers other than those detailed in this document
- c. The costs of additional accommodation/ meals outside of the NSWRL determined travel party per competition
- d. The costs of their own travel (and the away team travel) if they choose to take a fixture outside of the regular and/or recognised home venue. I.e. regional or out of state.
- e. Passports

For additional items requested by Clubs to be arranged via the NSWRL travel supplier as part of the bookings, a credit card must be provided to Travel Strategy (formally Journey Masters) before the additions can be booked.

Clubs are responsible for making sure they are aware of their players/officials passports and the subsequent travel/ VISA implications when travelling.

1.3 Air Travel

The following rules apply to air travel by Players and Club Officials in connection with participating in NSWRL Competition matches: -

- a. The NSWRL will block off all air travel as per this policy prior to the start of the season.
- b. Upgrades from economy class seats will not be available unless the Club pays the difference.
- c. Alterations to scheduled flights bookings are subject to NSWRL approval, and such approval will only by granted if there is no additional cost to NSWRL.
- d. Traveling party names to be sent to NSWRL and Travel Strategy by the requested date/ time in the appropriate template. Reasonable name changes can be made up until 48-hours prior to departure, changes made after this time will incur a fee which will be passed on to Clubs*. Clubs are responsible for ensuring traveling party names are correct once tickets are issued.
- e. Each person is booked with 1 x bag. Each airline has excess baggage as per appendix 1. If a Club requires additional baggage, they should request it prior via Journey Masters at a cost to the Club, otherwise requesting at the airport on day of travel will increase costs further.



1.4 Hotel Accommodation

The following rules apply in respect of hotel accommodation for Players and Club Officials: -

- a. Clubs must book hotel accommodation through NSWRL.
- b. Upgrades in accommodation will not be allowed.
- c. Clubs must notify NSWRL of any special meal requirements at least fourteen (14) days prior to departure.
- d. Alterations to hotel bookings are subject to NSWRL approval, and such approval will only be granted if there is no additional cost to NSWRL.
- e. If the home club relocates a match to another venue, the visiting club will be entitled to first choice of available hotel accommodation.
- f. Rooming list must be provided to the hotel and Travel Strategy by the required time frame (7 days prior to travel)

1.5 **Bus Travel**

The following rules apply in respect of Bus travel for Players and Club Officials:

- a. Clubs must book bus travel through NSWRL (unless NSWRL approval granted prior to season commencing).
- b. Alterations to Bus bookings are subject to NSWRL approval, and such approval will only be granted if there is no additional cost to NSWRL.
- c. The NSWRL does NOT cover the cost of a bus to the airport for clubs that are traveling interstate/over seas
- d. Bus travel is appointed for the Knock-On Effect NSW Cup, Jersey Flegg and Harvey Norman Women's Premiership where a team travels in line with the distances noted in the 'Travel Allowances' table
- e. Bus details/ requirements must be provided to the NSWRL via the requested form at least seven (7) business days prior to travelling



1.6 Variations to this Policy

- a. Only the NSWRL GM Football/ Head of Competitions (or nominee) can approve amendments to the Travel and Accommodation Policy.
- b. Clubs will need to pay directly for any additional costs outside the NSWRL Travel and Accommodation Policy. These must be done via Travel Strategy and payment made at the time of the booking request.
- c. If because of scheduling, the Club has to remain interstate/over-seas for an additional night, the NSWRL will cover the cost of the additional night's dinner (club will cover the cost of the first night's dinner).
- d. If because of scheduling, a club prefers to remain in a city following a match rather than returning to their base, such approval will only be granted if there is an overall cost saving to the NSWRL. In this case, the NSWRL contribution will still be limited to accommodation and breakfast. All other costs (e.g. lunch, dinner, incidentals) will be the responsibility of the club concerned.
- e. Savings made on budget by not utilising the full travel entitlement cannot be offset against any other travel or accommodation or carried forward for future use.
- f. Clubs planning to take a fixture away from their regular and/or recognised home venue. I.e. regional or out of state. Are required to seek permission and can only do so with approval from the NSWRL General Manager of football.

1.7 On Call Assistance

APPENDIX 2

Travel advice for LGBTQ+ Athletes, Officials and Staff travelling to Fiji

All travellers face risks overseas. Risks can be higher for travellers who are gay, lesbian or queer/questioning, or have a diverse gender identity (trans, non-binary or genderqueer).

This information has been prepared for LGBTQ+ players, officials and staff attending training and events in Fiji.

BE PREPARED

While the New South Wales Rugby League (NSWRL) has a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of direct and indirect homophobia, biphobia and transphobia they are not able to control all that happens outside controlled environments during international tours.

In the broader community, Fiji is rated 54th in the world for LGBTQ+ inclusion and respect. The equality index (www.equaldex.com) rated Fiji 54/100 for legal protections – a similar score to many other Pacific Islands but considerably below Australia and New Zealand.

Fijian laws prohibit the discrimination or harassment of gay, lesbian, bisexual or queer visitors, however, gay marriage is not legal, and community support is not universal – particularly in rural areas.

Traditional Fijian culture has a third gender known as the vaka sa lewa lewa. These individuals are assigned male at birth but fulfil a typically feminine role within society. Transgender and non-binary identities are not legally recognised or protected in Fiji. You could face entry restrictions if you have a passport with an 'X' gender marker. You may still be asked to provide binary sex information even if your passport has an 'X' gender marker. Contact the Australian High Commission before you arrive at the border to confirm if authorities will accept passports with 'X' gender markers.

BE SMART

As with any community, levels of acceptance, tolerance and inclusion will vary. Be cautious with public displays of affection in conservative spaces, as this could still lead to verbal abuse and assault.

If you intend to party in Fiji, speak to other LGBTQ+ travellers before you go to get advice. Ensure that your behaviour complies with your club and NSWRL/NRL's Codes of Conduct.

Be cautious of new friendships, particularly those made online or using apps. LGBTQ+ travellers can be targeted by criminals, as the rates of reporting these types of offences are generally lower due to perceived stigma and shame.



BE READY

Recognising the compounding impact of other diverse identities, including your race, religion, age, mental health and disability, is important. The SmartTraveller website (smarttraveller.gov.au) provides essential information about how these intersecting identities may bring their own risks.

APPENDIX 3

Travel advice for LGBTQ+ Athletes, Officials and Staff travelling to New Zealand

All travellers face risks overseas. Risks can be higher for travellers who are gay, lesbian or queer/questioning, or have a diverse gender identity (trans, non-binary or genderqueer).

This information has been prepared for LBTQ+ players, officials and staff attending training and events in New Zealand.

BE PREPARED

While the New South Wales Rugby League (NSWRL) has a zero-tolerance approach to all forms of direct and indirect homophobia, biphobia and transphobia they are not able to control all that happens outside controlled environments during international tours.

In the broader community, New Zealand is rated 16th in the world for LGBTQ+ inclusion and respect. The equality index (www.equaldex.com) rated New Zealand 87/100 for legal protections – comparable to Australia's score of 90/100. New Zealand records a slightly higher level of support in the Public Opinion Index (64/100 to 62/100)

New Zealand laws prohibit the discrimination or harassment of gay, lesbian, bisexual or queer visitors. Both transgender and non-binary gender identities are legally recognised and protected in New Zealand. Support for transgender discrimination protections ranked #1 globally.

New Zealand recognises same-sex relationships and preserves Australian rights such as healthcare visitation, accommodation bookings and next-of-kin privileges.

NOTE: This advice does not consider free associated territories within the Realm of New Zealand (Tokelau, Niue and the Cook Islands).

BE SMART

As with any community, levels of acceptance, tolerance and inclusion will vary. Be cautious with public displays of affection in conservative spaces, as this could still lead to verbal abuse and assault. If you intend to party in New Zealand, speak to other LGBTQ+ travellers before you go to get advice. Ensure that your behaviour complies with your club and NSWRL/NRL's Codes of Conduct

Be cautious of new friendships, particularly those made online or using apps. LGBTQ+ travellers can be targeted by criminals, as the rates of reporting these types of offences are generally lower due to perceived stigma and shame.



BE READY
